Internal references (pp. 403, 417) reveal that it was compiled by Richard Ellis and the dates of his last payments coincide with those of his main account.

And I do sweare to be true, faythfull and loyall to his Excellency, my Lord and Master Robert, Erle of Leycester etc. And namely that I shall faithefullye kepe secrett all suche things as secrettly by worde or wryting shalbe from tyme to tyme by his Excellency or others in his name committed

to me, and shall not reveale the same to anye person but with the assent and good lyking of his Excellency, nor holde any intelligence by speache, wryting or message with any to the contrarye. And in case I shall hear or understande anythinge tending directly or indirectly to the hurt or prejudice of her Majesties person and dignitye, or of his Excellency or against the estate, service and weale of the United Provinces of these Lowe Countries, I shall fourthwith make the same knowen unto his Excellency. So healpe me God.
