**A. The Book of My Lords Servantt Wages  
and Boord Wages, 1559–1561  
(Longleat, Dudley Papers III, fos. 1–17)**

A paper book bound into Dudley Papers III (a volume of miscellaneous papers assembled after Canon Jackson's sorting of the Longleat Papers).<sup>a</sup> It is the first item in the volume and the foliation is sequential throughout. There is a modern pencil note on fo. 1, 'E of Leycester. Book of Servants Bordwages Etc. 1 Eliz. 1558–9' [*sic*]. Internal references (pp. 403, 417) reveal that it was compiled by Richard Ellis and the dates of his last payments coincide with those of his main account.
